The Sierra Nevada is critical infrastructure for communities in our region as well as those across the state, country, and planet. The Sierra Nevada is home to:

- > One of the world's most diverse watersheds, providing nearly 60 percent of California's water supply and
- > Some of the most massive, ancient, and important trees on the planet, storing as much or more carbon per acre as rainforests do

The forests of Tahoe are not in good health and are in grave danger. They are choked with undergrowth, and impacted by drought and bark beetles. They are tinderboxes waiting to explode.

THE TIME IS NOW

WE HAVE AN URGENT RESPONSIBILITY TO ACT

In 2021, over 2.5 million acres of land burned in California.

The impact of these megafires is felt statewide—in water quality and quantity, biodiversity, carbon and climate outcomes, human health, economic devastation, community and ecological resilience, and much more.

When the Tahoe forests burn, the impact to our community and climate will be devastating—and will be felt far beyond our region.

We have a responsibility to join together to implement progressive solutions to ensure forest health for generations to come.

Forest Futures identifies, builds, accelerates and scales the solutions we need—setting in motion a series of projects, initiatives and funding mechanisms to achieve these essential goals.

We need to stop these fires before they start.



COMMUNITY LEVEL CLIMATE ACTION

WE CAN ACCELERATE SOLUTIONS THROUGH FOREST ACTION

Communities around the globe will face their own unique climate impacts. For Tahoe and for California, wildfire and drought are the dire impacts we face.

We see it directly in the years with minimal snowfall.

We see it when catastrophic wildfires flank our communities.

Creating healthy forests gives us the opportunity to protect California's air quality, access to water and ensure wildlife habitat. Our unique role as stewards of the Tahoe forests give us a front row seat and an important role to play.

We face a systemic challenge and it requires a systemic solution.

Healthy forests in our community can stimulate the local economy, ensure a safer and more secure future for our region and create an actionable path forward to healthy forests everywhere.

The model we are building is a holistic approach that others can learn from and replicate. Our success will demonstrate that a locally driven approach to climate action can be scaled in communities across the state and the country. We are building a nimble, flexible capital fund for three guiding principles:

COLLABORATE Pave the pathway for swifter, larger restoration of our lands through education and collaboration with the community.

INNOVATE Rise above the roadblocks; unlock discrete logjams through grants and investments designed to keep restoration workers working.

REGENERATE Invest in climate and economic resilience, building a marketplace for the effective, sustainable use of forest biomass.

And, we have been putting our expertise, resources and capital into the problem as we learn.


NATURE FUND Over \$1 million allocated to regional organizations to:

- > understand the problem;
- > build deep and trusted relationships; and
- > improve forest health.

COLLABORATIVE GRANTS Fund collaborations to speed hazardous forest biomass removal.

ENGAGEMENT Community, regional and statewide leadership join together to devise concrete solutions for forest biomass use.





PROTECT COMMUNITIES

ENSURE THE FOREST REMAINS A PART OF OUR FUTURE

Protecting our communities is possible—but it requires immediate collaborative action to mandate forest management best practices.

Incentivize neighborhood and community projects. Forest Futures will create incentives for neighborhoods in local communities to protect the wildland-urban interface in their backyards. The cost of tree thinning and defensible space work in neighborhoods is often prohibitive.

Enable sustainable forest treatments. Forest Futures will catalyze large scale fuel reduction projects in the forests surrounding our communities, and assist long-term planning and prioritization goals on federal, state and locally managed landscapes. With limited evacuation routes, it is critical that we reduce fuel loads alongside major roads.

Promote the understanding and necessity of fuel reduction and forest treatment practices. Forest Futures will educate, coordinate and convene to enable our community to become willing, proactive advocates for sustainable restoration. **Lack of community education is a significant roadblock to scaled, sustainable forest management in the wildland-urban interface.**



BUILD FOREST ECONOMY

LAY THE GROUNDWORK FOR A STRONGER, MORE SECURE LOCAL ECONOMY

Diversifying our regional economy through innovative workforce and infrastructure development will both improve our regional economic resilience and drive restoration of our forest lands.

Fund new infrastructure to enable the removal of hazardous biomass from overcrowded forests. Forest Futures will invest in the infrastructure required to remove this material from the forest, providing regional economic opportunity in the process. Today, hundreds of thousands of piles of biomass sit on forest floors without the ability to remove, transport or process them.

Implement local green waste collaboratives. Forest Futures will support regional partnerships for collaborative remediation and use of green waste in our communities, neighborhoods and districts. The infrastructure and structured partnerships necessary to effectively aggregate green waste across communities doesn't exist.

Foster a biomass-centered strategy. Forest Futures will advocate to prioritize and incentivize alternative and higher uses for the material coming out of our forests. The threat to communities and the environment requires coordinated leadership, infrastructure and strategy.



ACCELERATE MARKET SOLUTIONS

ENABLE NEW TECHNOLOGIES AND BIOMASS UTILIZATION OPPORTUNITIES

Encouraging new technology and incentivizing alternative and higher uses for woody material.

Seek new market solutions to speed and scale forest restoration. Forest Futures will fund new technologies and biomass utilization opportunities. Hazardous woody materials from our forests can be used to create a sustainable, carbon-neutral building and energy economy.

Attract and leverage funders and investors with community-level impact investment.

Forest Futures will provide this critical financing to uplift marketable product creation from local woody biomass supply. Businesses which rely on the use of forest biomass from fuel reduction projects face insurmountable financing gaps: They need long-term, patient debt and investment capital to start-up and succeed.

Provide working capital for projects. Forest Futures will provide flexible financial capital to increase the pace and scale of forest restoration. **Projects are frequently stymied due** to delays in federal or state funding.

Rising above roadblocks to restoration at scale requires investment in community education, stakeholder network building and advocacy—with and for the people of our region.




REGENERATE

We will grow raised capital to \$100 million through investing in larger-scale forest ventures.


