



TTAD MISSION & REGIONAL IMPACT

The Truckee Tahoe Airport aims to provide safe, high-quality services and facilities, reduce impact on airport neighbors and the environment, and invest in opportunities that increase community safety and provide sustained benefit to the entire

Truckee Tahoe region.



TTCF MISSION

To connect people and opportunities, generating resources to build a more caring, creative, and effective community











A SHARED COMMITMENT FOR COMMUNITY IMPACT

Since 2021, TTCF has supported administration of the Annual TTAD Agency Partnership Application Cycle with a focus on:

Leveraging the knowledge, skills, and best practices of a community-based review model Aligning public dollars to public mission through a rigorous & balanced committee process

Building the application process and providing guided technical assistance to prospective Agency Partnership Program applicants

Maintaining transparency with the community and general public on the process end-to-end





THE TTAD AGENCY PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

- TTAD partners with local agencies and nonprofits in support of larger, regional projects and programs
- In 2023, the program awarded \$434,893 to8 organizations
- Partnership must be endorsed by formal motion or resolution of another public agency providing significant contribution to project
- TTAD's purpose is aviation and the **project**focus must tie back to the airport's goals
 and mission
- Baseline award amount over \$5,000
- Funding is not for general operating support
- Organizations already receiving other TTAD
 support valued over \$1,000 are not eligible



Agency Partnerships must:

- Be responsive to community needs
- Build value for the Airport District
- Reflect the Airport District's Mission,
 Goals, and Public Purpose
- Have broad and meaningful reach and impact into the local community





AIRPORT PUBLIC PURPOSE EXAMPLES

- Aviation or other services provided by TTAD
- Transportation related to use of TTAD property
- Aviation-related noise mitigation and avoidance
- Conservation and similar aviation buffer efforts
- Aviation-related public safety efforts
- Science Technology Engineering Arts and Math (STEAM) education
- Workforce housing
- Greenhouse gas emissions reductions and offsets
- Natural Resource Management







CAPITAL CAMPAIGNS

"Capital campaigns are considered on a discretionary basis when they demonstrate broad community impact and alignment with the objectives of the program and/or annual board-stated goals."

- Policy Instruction 311

Considerations may include:


- Is the timing right to make a Capital Campaign funding request for this project?
 - What are the goals within this funding phase of the project?
- Is this project a prudent use of public funds?
 - Is this a feasible project?
 - What % of funding has already been secured?
- Will the project be dependent on AP Funding for success?
- Will the TTAD AP funds be spent within 2025?







PRE-APPLICATION CHECKLIST



✓ Go to Agency Partnership Page of TTCF Website to access application portal

- Access Code: airport
- Complete Eligibility Quiz in online request system
- ✓ Obtain e-copies of the formal motion or resolution endorsing agency partnership active during the proposed program term

OR

Ensure a plan to obtain formal motion or resolution prior to application deadline of August 30, 2024





2024 APPLICATION TIMELINE & KEY DATES

1. APPLICATION SUBMISSION PERIOD

Self-serve eligibility quiz and technical assistance offered to prospective applicants in order to submit an ontime application. 2. DUE DILIGENCE REVIEW

Review committee evaluates applications across a common set of metrics and criteria. 3. RECOMMENDATIONS & VOTE

presented to TTAD
Board for
consideration and
formal resolution to
approve based on
score and
community impact.

June 27th

Workshop for prospective applicants

July 1

Application portal opens

August 30th

Application portal closes

August 30th - Sept. 30th

Committee review & decision-making

October 23rd

TTAD Board of Directors Meeting

October 24th

Notifications of funding decisions to applicants







FAQ AND Q&A

- What if we do not have a partnership in place?
 - Applicants must have a formal resolution from their public agency board or their partnering public agency's board to apply to the AP process
- Who selects the TTAD Review Committee?
 - Combined efforts from TTCF & TTAD
- How much \$\$ should we request?
 - o Over \$5,000
- How will I know if our project serves Airport Public Purpose?
 - Please review the <u>Policy Instruction (PI) 311</u> for examples of funded project types
 - Take the Eligibility Quiz found in the application portal
- If we are awarded funding, what are the next steps?
 - Notifications of funding decisions will be sent by October 24th
 - Contracts will be created and checks will be submitted before the end of the calendar year
