

Community Collaborative of Tahoe Truckee Resource Sharing Meeting Summary Notes February 02, 2021, 10:00 am to 12:00 pm

Purpose: Provide real-time, up-to-date information about things happening in our community and to offer opportunities for connection.

County Resources and Vaccination Information:

<u>Connecting Point</u> operates the **211** service in Placer and Nevada Counties and is a resource and information hub that connects people with community programs and services through a searchable web page and 24/7 local call center.

Connect by Phone: Dial 2-1-1 or 1-833-DIAL211 to speak with a 211 call specialist. By Text: Text your zip code to 898211 to start a conversation.

Connecting Point 211 is also an entry point for specific rental assistance programs through Tenant Based Rental Assistance (<u>TBRA</u>) and <u>AMI Housing</u> and is an entry point for the <u>Coordinated Entry</u> system.

Connecting Point 211 works closely with public health to operate the COVID-19 HelpLine. They have seen a 400% increase in calls over the last two weeks. Tahoe Forest Hospital

Tahoe Forest Hospital is operating a COVID-19 vaccination clinic in Truckee at Sierra College. Currently they are only vaccinating 75+ older (a change from two weeks ago when they were vaccinating 65+). They are also assisting Nevada County to complete phase 1A. Those 65+ who received their first vaccination will receive their second dose. Vaccination supply is limited by each county according to their population and resources. The amount of doses available per week aren't known until the Friday before. For up-to-date information, sign up on 211 to receive text alerts.

TTUSD Update:

TTUSD returned to hybrid instruction on Monday, 2/1/21. The Teachers Union is concerned about COVID-19 virus variants and so the District has supplied teachers with respirator masks and middle and high school classrooms with MERV 13 purifiers. A staff member continues to drive tests to Folsom daily, resulting in a turnaround as low as 24 hours for test results. As of

January 14th, CA Department of Public Health has new guidelines for districts to follow in order to open 5 days a week for in person instruction. TTUSD is reviewing the guidelines.

Eviction Moratorium Extension Update

A new state law, the COVID-19 Tenant Relief Act (SB 91), went into effect on February 1, 2021. It extends the moratorium against evictions to June 30, 2021. The law protects tenants with a COVID-19-related financial impact from eviction for nonpayment of rent if the tenant provides the landlord with a signed declaration and as long as the tenant pays 25% of rent due. SB 91 also provides financial assistance to qualifying tenants (through federal funding) with household income below 80% of the area median income (AMI), giving priority to households earning 50% (AMI). Landlords can also apply to get 80% rent arrearages. However, they have to explicitly agree to forgive the 25% owed to participate. Resource Sharing:

- Adventure Risk Challenge (ARC) is beginning recruitment for Summer 2021 programs in Tahoe, Yosemite, and Sequoia Kings Canyon. These programs are for motivated high school students in California and Reno. Our courses run for 33 days where students are based at UC field stations and also participate in backpacking, rock climbing, and whitewater rafting expeditions. The programs include English and Environmental Science classes which are eligible for elective credit. Tuition is on a sliding scale (minimum contribution \$1/day).
