	Sierra Native Alliance Activity: Connecting with the Pre-Colonial World
Loren and Anno	Nakai of <u>Sierra Native Alliance</u> joined CCTT to help us recognize and hold space for honoring Indigenous People's Day

- Loren and Anno Nakai of <u>Sierra Native Alliance</u> joined CCTT to help us recognize and hold space for honoring Indigenous People's Day and Hispanic Heritage Month. Sierra Native Alliance's mission is to empower Native youth and families in the Sierra Nevada Foothills through family education, cultural resources and environmental education. They provide domestic violence and substance abuse services.
- Loren sang a traditional song based on "The Lone Woman of San Nicholas Island" to acknowledge the place and people of Washoe County and the resiliency of human beings.
- Anno presented a lesson about the pre-colonial vs post-colonial world values that built on our August meeting of white dominant culture.
 - Anno began the discussion by telling us how difficult it is for Indigenous Peoples to have Columbus Day celebrated as a federal holiday when it represents the historic genocide of Native people. Anno explained that 90% of the native population across the Americas (from Alaska to Latin America) died as a result and those that survived were very resilient and relied on traditional values.
 - \circ $\;$ From the native perspective pre-colonial/traditional values were:
 - If you take care of nature, nature will take care of you. If you are out of harmony with nature or you violate the laws of nature, there will be a natural consequence.
 - We're all related
 - There's a circular worldview or circular concept of time
 - Collaboration
 - Valuing elders
