WE LOVE THIS PLACE

\$123 MILLION ATTRACTED, AND COUNTING

Our first **Impact Agenda** made a bold declaration: TTCF set out to attract more than \$100 million to our region. This audacious goal seemed improbable for a small rural community foundation. It was, but we never intended to do it alone. Before the five-year mark, we're proud to share that we have surpassed that goal and are climbing.

Through our fundraising and advocacy within TTCF's initiatives, TTCF directly raised **\$16,870,316**. This work leveraged an additional **\$106,637,085**. As of publication, the total funds attracted to regional projects equals **\$123,507,401!**

In North Tahoe-Truckee, housing, families, and forest health are all interconnected issues. When we chose these areas of focus, we knew they were vital to protecting what is most significant to us. As we navigate the challenges that impact this region, we understand that resources are best attracted to aligned strategies and engaged leadership.

A STRATEGY FOR RESILIENCE

The challenges that would soon disrupt our lives were only peeking over the horizon in 2017. We had no idea they'd sweep in as heavy and inescapable as a global pandemic, two catastrophic wildfires surrounding our region, a record breaking winter, and a growing housing crisis. Meanwhile, all around us, neighbors of all ages silently struggled with mental health needs.

We knew we were facing challenges that were much bigger than us, bigger than any single organization or grant cycle. It became clear that reacting to issues as they arose wasn't working. A better strategy emerged. One that brought diverse players with their own unique knowledge and skills – schools, businesses, health care systems, nonprofits, local leaders – to lay the groundwork for systems change.

Looking forward, TTCF sees an opportunity to transform the way our region approaches all challenges, a way to make **strategic readiness** part of who we are. TTCF has two key strengths to lend to this effort. First, by nature of being a community foundation and managing endowments, we play the long game. Second, as a grantmaker and community leader since 1998, we value the trust and expertise of our community leaders, and incorporate their voices and strategy so that we are smarter together. Five years into this work, TTCF has grown a rich network of partners who inform every step.

We actively seek out solutions and supporters who are also willing to explore uncharted territories.

VENTURES CATALYZED

Community House EST. 2014 - An impact investment securing a shared headquarters for safety net services was fortified by a merger of four safety-net organizations in 2019. Sierra Community House is the central hub for families to receive critical support for their well-being and safety.

Mountain Town Community Foundations EST. 2017 - A networked group of colleagues sharing resources and ideas to address mountain community challenges.

Mountain Housing Council EST. 2017 - A 29 agency partner network, committed to accelerating housing solutions for our region.

Placemate FORMERLY LANDING LOCALS - A social enterprise, seeded by TTCF in 2018, connecting homeowners and renters to unlock homes for local workforces across the country.

Behavioral Health Road Map EST. 2021 - A strategic partnership highlighting gaps and opportunities to better serve the mental health needs of our region.

Community Organizations Active in Disaster (COAD) EST. 2022 - A regional force of community partners providing a unified front for disaster preparedness.

The Housing Hub EST. 2023 - A social enterprise fostering innovative housing solutions for our small-scale developers.

Forest Entrepreneurs Competition - Launching 2024. A regional challenge growing market-based solutions for regenerative forest practices.

Forest 'Tonka' Truck Strategy - 2023/2024 seeking seed funding. A social enterprise providing access to large equipment for private landowners, allowing more efficient forestry management.



TOMORROW'S TRAILBLAZERS



A community foundation serves its region across generations, and acts accordingly. TTCF believes that a community's strength is tied to the sense of belonging that we feel to one another and to this place. It is that kinship that inspires people to show up for their community.

TTCF is deeply committed to, and invested in, nurturing individuals who are eager to enhance their leadership skills, making the path to growth accessible to all. We are dedicated to providing our next generation with unparalleled access to education, training, and support networks. As well as cultivating an environment where every aspiring leader can thrive.

KEY ENDEAVORS

Youth Scholarships - A total of \$4,836,907 has been awarded since 2012, supporting our young people who wish to pursue trade school and collegiate institutions. An additional \$3.4 million has been facilitated with outside community scholarship groups.

Supplemental Scholarships - Since 2022, these scholarships promote contribution back to the community. In the first two years, \$275,000 scholarships were awarded to 20 young adults to propel them toward their goals.

Board Governance - By training 189 nonprofit board members, this program equips community members with the skills and knowledge needed to serve effectively on various boards. This training fosters a culture of robust and inclusive governance.

On-the-Verge - This program has been a catalyst for emerging leaders, offering comprehensive support and mentorship to individuals poised to make a significant community impact.

Forest Futures Salon Series - Since 2018, this series has been a dynamic platform for fostering insightful discussions and knowledge sharing. It invites diverse voices to contribute to the dialogue surrounding our forest's sustainable future.

READY FOR INVESTMENT



The world is changing, and so is philanthropy.

TTCF is at the forefront of this change, with some of the most innovative cross-sector leaders influencing the way we approach our work. We have expanded the way we think about solving problems, who gets a voice at the table, and the ways we attract, leverage, and disperse funds within our region.

From grantmaking to impact investing, we bring the right type of financial capital to our investment opportunities. Since we first released our Impact Agenda, our endeavors have yielded a 1:5 leverage, amplifying our impact across our initiatives. Our programmatic efforts have yielded a 1:12 ratio.

Having laid the groundwork, we are ready to step into the next phase of this work. We have the partner-driven strategies, innovative opportunities, engaged and trained leaders, and resources to leverage.
